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THE ATTITUDE OF GRATITUDE

"In everything give thanks." I Thessalonians 5:18

Expressing gratitude and giving thanks seems to be a lost art in our society. For many of us, complaining is part of our daily lives. We regularly complain about the weather, the government, our jobs....the list goes on! A lack of gratitude in our lives can lead to an increase in depression. Scientific research tells us that gratitude is a powerful force that can change our mood, lift us out of depression and even improve our physical health. God knew this before the scientists did. Throughout the ages, God has encouraged His people to practice praise and thanksgiving. Israel had an entire book of praise songs for this purpose. (The Book of Psalms) Becoming a "praiser" will open up more of God's blessings in your life!

HAVE A THANKFUL HEART

To give thanks means to be grateful or to express gratitude. The Bible also speaks much about praise, which means to boast about, to speak well of and to laud. God wants us to practice praise from a heart full of gratitude every day. Having God in your life is a great reason to be thankful! The Apostle Paul wrote to the Thessalonians saying, "In every situation [no matter what circumstances] be thankful and the continually give thanks to God; for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." (I Thessalonians 5:18 AMP) Notice, we are to be thankful "in" the circumstance, "for" the circumstance. not necessary Regardless of what we are facing, we can be thankful knowing that God is always with us to aid, protect and deliver us out of any bad situation. Maintaining an attitude of thankfulness and praise will keep you strong and keep God's power on the scene.

THANKFUL IN DIFFICULT TIMES

When we're going through difficult times, it can be a challenge to stay thankful. Praising

God through a tough season can feel like a real sacrifice. Paul exhorted the Hebrews about this: "Therefore, let us offer through Jesus a continual sacrifice of praise to God." (Hebrews 13:15 NLT) A sacrifice of praise happens when we don't feel like praising, but do it out of obedience to God's Word. The psalmist David tells us to praise at all times, not just when we feel good or when everything is going our way. "I will praise the Lord at all times. I will constantly speak his praises." (Psalms **34:1)** When we praise through the hard times, we will experience joy and freedom. This is what happened to Paul and Silas in the Book of Acts. On one of their missionary journeys, they were unjustly accused, beaten and imprisoned. Instead of crying or complaining about their circumstances, Paul and Silas began praising God. "Around midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening. Suddenly, there was a massive earthquake, and the prison was shaken to its foundations. All the doors immediately flew open, and the chains of every prisoner fell off!" (Acts 16:25-26 NLT) This is one of many examples of how the power of praise brought freedom and deliverance to God's people.

BENEFITS OF GRATITUDE

Here are some important benefits you will gain from practicing gratitude:

Gratitude keeps us in God's will
 I Thessalonians 5:18 says that it is God's will that we be thankful. Being thankful keeps us connected with God's plan for our lives. Complaining was devastating for the Israelites and cost them their opportunity to enter the promised land. (See Numbers 14:27-29)

2. Gratitude gives us peace

Peace is the result of practicing joyfulness and approaching God with thanksgiving, as seen in Paul's letter to the Philippians. "Rejoice in the Lord always...in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:4-7 KJV)

3. Gratitude helps us grow

When you endure through trials with a grateful attitude, your faith will grow stronger. As a result, you will be ready to face anything. "Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles of any kind come your way, consider it an **opportunity for great joy**. For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow." (James 1:2-3 NLT) 4. Gratitude looks good on us

The Passion Translation of Psalm 147:1 says it well: "Hallelujah! Praise the Lord! How beautiful it is when we **sing our praises** to the beautiful God, for praise makes you lovely before him and brings him great delight!" Our attitude of gratitude causes us to become more attractive, both to God and also to the people around us.

Make a decision to become grateful everyday. Developing a lifestyle of praise will manifest the blessings in your life.
