"In these lay a multitude of sick people, blind, lame, paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water." John 5:3 (NKJV)

"Waiting for the moving of the water" is a term in Scripture used to describe a special move of God manifestation of the Spirit. Sick people would gather regularly at the pool of Bethesda during the time Jesus walked the earth. They were waiting for a miracle, or a manifestation of God's Spirit to initiate something spectacular. People today are often looking for something spectacular and missing out on the supernatural. We forget that faith is supernatural. Smith Wigglesworth, an old time English preacher, who was used mightily of God in miraculous healings said, "If the power of God is not in manifestation, I turn on the power by an act of faith". You see, God's power is everywhere and faith makes it work. Just like those at the pool in John 5, there are many today waiting for Jesus to come by and minister to them. Unfortunately, many will not receive the help they need because they are stuck "waiting for the moving of the waters" or a special move of God. You may not receive an instant healing, but you can be restored to health by using your faith on a daily basis. One woman in the Bible who was a "hopeless case" according to medical doctors, decided she wasn't going to wait around for a special move of God. Against all odds, she used her faith and was proactive in seeking her healing. She got results! Jesus told her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace. Your suffering is over." (Mark 5:34 NLT) Don't wait for a special move of Divine power. Faith is now. Whatever you need in your life, whether it's a physical healing, or freedom from bondages or addictions, you can use your faith to work for you. Find Scriptures that speak to your situation. claim those promises yourself, thanking God for the answer. In this way, you can turn on the switch of faith and initiate your recovery.
